  - This year we are asking everyone to order their luminaries online. You can order them at
     <u>www.relayforlife.org/bayareatx</u> which is a secure website. Just go to the website, scroll down, and
     select the box which says: Luminaria.
  - Under Dedicate a Luminaria, select "Team". Type Gamma Nu Luminary Club in the box and click Search.
  - o Click on Gamma Nu Luminary Club when it appears.
  - Select the type of luminaria (amount) you want to order (only one name per luminary) and then Personalize your luminaria. (Check "In Honor, In Memory, or In Support" and then add their name.)
  - O Click Next and you can review your order.
  - Scroll down to Add Another to add another name if you are ordering more than one.
  - After adding all of the names you want to order, click on Next. Add your billing and payment information.
  - o Click Purchase.

### **Early Educator Grant Winners**

The voting is finished and the winners have been contacted! Meet our Early Educator Grant Winners!

Elizabeth Keomanikhoth is a first-year 3rd grade teacher at James Bowie Elementary. Her grant is entitled "Reading Readiness and Everyday School Materials". I am focusing on reading and writing a lot this year. A lot of my students are behind due to the pandemic and online teaching. Many of them are at Kindergarten or 1st grade reading levels because of the online instruction that has been in place for the last couple of years due to the pandemic. I would love to be able to purchase books that are on-level for the students in my classroom. A lot of my books are 3rd grade reading level (on-level) and are too hard for them to read. This would help purchase books that they would actually be able to read and enjoy. I would also be able to purchase classroom supplies. A lot of our students are underprivileged and do not have the appropriate supplies they need. I already have some classroom supplies, but we are starting to run low.

Her objective is to progress them to  $2^{nd}$  grade or  $3^{rd}$  grade reading levels by the end of the year. She wants to purchase on-level books and classroom materials. She will access the success of the project by testing results showing if the children have moved up in reading levels.

Elizabeth Ruiz is a first year Pre-Kindergarten teacher at San Jacinto Elementary. Her grant is entitled "Here We Grow". Our school district opened a state-of-the-art museum quality Early Learning Academy for Pre-Kindergarten this year. Here student will develop inhibitory control and brain function through right brain left brain teaching that will contribute to their academic success for the rest of their lives. Two of the amazing classrooms that all students will get to engage in are agriculture centered. One is "Farm to Market" where students get hands-on experience of where their food comes from while they raise farm fresh eggs in their on-site chicken coop and learn about how agriculture play a role in their everyday lives. The other agriculture centered classroom is called "Here We Grow". In this classroom students will learn about all things plants. From the planting tables, seed counting activities to the amazing hydroponics systems; students will gain amazing plant science skills, while helping to grow produce for their campus and to sell in their community. The goals for this project include giving students a hands-on approach to learning the Texas PreK Guideline for science. Students will gain a greater understand of the characteristics of plants and their life cycle through directly working with their classroom hydroponics system. This project will introduce students to new produce that will be utilized in the school lunch program as well a farmer's market programs where produce grown on campus will be taken to the local farmers market. Among other produce, students

will grow pickling cucumbers and dill so that students and teachers can then make pickles. These pickles will be canned and sold at the farmer's market. The funds raised through the farmer's market will then be put back into the project to buy more supplies. We see a great value in getting our students involved in hands on agriculture and truly engaged in the learning process. The fund received from this grant will be instrumental in purchasing necessary supplies to grow produce, introduce students to produce they may not have tried, market the produce and can produce which can then be sold at our local farmer's market.

Success will be measured by students' test scores in relation to the Pre-K guidelines. It will also be measured by the ability to grow produce to be utilized on the campus for the school lunch program as well as the ability to grow produce to make pickles to be sold at the farmer's market. A successful project will be self-sustaining as funds generated will be put back into the project to keep it going!

Congratulations to both of these winners – their students will be the true winners this year!
