## **Early Educator Grant Winners**

The voting is finished and the winners have been contacted! Meet our Early Educator Grant Winners!

**Diana Torres Castillo** is a 3rd grade teacher at Harlem Elementary. Her grant is entitled "Math Manipulatives to the Rescue!" She states her students have regressed in their mathematical understanding as an effect of the time away from school due to the pandemic.

With the purchase of math manipulatives and games, her students will be able to close the learning gap with the use of physical/tactile manipulatives. These manipulatives and games will help her students to better understand math processes through hands-on activities.

Annalissa Garcia is a 2nd grade teacher at Clark Elementary. Her grant is entitled "Constructing a Culture of Readers – One Student at a Time". She states her students have regressed in reading due to COVID. In her class, more than half are not reading on grade level. One of her campus goals is to ensure that 90% of the students are making a year's growth. Her campus has completed a book study and has found that one of the big pieces missing from their classroom libraries is books which relate to their students.

This grant will allocate funding to begin building their classroom libraries with more multicultural books. When students are finding more books which they can relate to and which fit their interest level, then they are more likely to read more often.
